I have created a resource for speech and language therapists that utilises images generated by AI, specifically from OpenAI's DALL-E, accompanied by sets of questions designed to engage children in conversation. The prompts and questions were formulated by AI based on the Marion Blank's levels of questioning. I have not made any alterations in order to demonstrate the capabilities and limitations of AI-generated content (personally I feel some of the level 2 questions are quite complex but see what you think!)

This resource is intended as a tool for exploring how AI can supplement traditional methods and to identify where a human touch is essential. Please feel free to use and adapt this resource as needed to fit your specific contexts and let me know what you think about the appropriateness and complexity of the questions relative to the intended Blank levels. If you do use this with children you are working with I would be interested to know how you and they find it.




Enchanted Forest Storybook

- 8. Imagine the garden changes with the seasons. What would it look like in winter?




Wizard's Library with Magical Artifacts
